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
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

Flexible learning possibilities



Vocational education reform

to enhance VET's appeal to better align with future trends, expand choices after graduation, and ensure a longer-lasting skill set.

CURRICULUM REFORM

- + Extended study duration
- + New concept for secondary education
- + Emphasis on cross-disciplinary skills
- + Comprehensive, individualised curricula
- + Practical skill assessments

SCHOOL NETWORK REFORM

- + Regional education centers to provide wide range of learning pathways
- + Competency-based division of schools
- + New funding mechanisms

NEW VET LAW in 2024

- + Makes changes to start reforms
- + New VET Law for 2027 to perpetuate the new concept



- Funded by Recovery and Resilience Facility (RRF)
- Budget: 5 mln. EUR
- Implementing bodies: Ministry of Education and Research, Estonian Education and Youth Board, Estonian Qualifications Authority
