**Profile of participants:**

This event aims **to attract newcomers to KA101 and KA229**. Participants should be Post-Primary **teachers/Schools Managers of pupil's age 12-18 years**. The target group is language teachers or those who are interested in using Erasmus+ to support language teaching and learning. We are keen to attract schools that have been active in other European/International programmes such as eTwinning; European Day of Languages; European Language Label etc. to encourage them to see the potential of Erasmus+ projects.

**Themes and goals of the event:**

This is a study visit (with additional training elements) targeting school managers and teachers (particularly language teachers) who are interested in using Erasmus+ to support language teaching and learning. The programme will include opportunities to meet schools active in the Erasmus+ programme to showcase what they're doing and the impact of their projects. **The aim is to promote best practice and inspire newcomers to engage in Erasmus+.** We will particularly emphasize how Erasmus+ can support post-primary language teaching and learning; and how it links to national and European language policy.

**Objectives of the event:**

- To attract newcomers to engage in Erasmus+ Schools activities, particularly those already active at European level through other initiatives.
- To showcase existing projects and the impact Erasmus+ projects can have.
- To emphasize how Erasmus+ can support language teaching and learning.

### Expected results:

The participants will:

- gain a better understanding of how Erasmus+ activities can support language learning and teaching;
- be inspired by the projects they visit;
- gain new ideas as well as next steps in building European projects;
- have the chance to share and meet European language education colleagues;
- possibly meet partners for future projects.

### Cost:

**Event fee:** the hosting NA agency will cover the hosting costs.

**Travel costs:** SEPIE will contribute to the travel costs based on the table provided for TCAs. This financial support will be paid directly to the selected participant by SEPIE in compliance with the procedures established by this agency (see information on the SEPIE website).

**Support for accommodation and meals not included in the activity programme:** SEPIE will contribute to these costs based on the table provided for TCAs. This financial support will include accommodation during the seminar and up to 2 travel days and it will be paid directly to the selected participant by SEPIE in compliance with the procedures established by this agency (see information on the SEPIE website).
